





## FROM THE DIRECTOR

Here are some items from over the last few weeks:

**Library Referendums** – Congratulations to all of our member libraries that were on the ballot on May 21! All library votes were successful by wide margins. We had one instance where a budget vote for the school failed (Newfield School), but the library vote (Newfield Public Library) was successful. It is always affirming to see voters believe in the positive nature of library ballot funding.

**Pest Management in Libraries** – While this is something that brings a lot of fear in our libraries, outbreaks of bed bugs and other pests like cockroaches do happen occasionally in our libraries. We have had one extremely minor instance of bed bugs at a library and one library that had cockroaches in library materials recently returned to them.

FLLS has worked with our directors to have pest policies and advise our library directors on how to work with patrons that might be bringing bed bugs or other pests into the library. If you need sample policies, please reach out to Sarah or Heidi—we are happy to help.

This is a great chance to remind you that before the pandemic, when our libraries were experiencing larger outbreaks of bed bugs, Finger Lakes Library System purchased bed bug heat boxes or "cookers" as we commonly refer to them for all of our libraries. These devices safely heat books and other common library materials to the temperature needed to kill the pests. The hot box provided by FLLS will kill ants, bed bugs, cockroaches, dust mites, scabies, lice, moths and carpet beetles. FLLS also owns and lends out a larger heat box that can even fit furniture such as chairs. This device is for use by libraries only and can't be loaned out to patrons.

**State Aid for Library Construction** – A reminder that the NY State portal for library construction opens next week. I've visited three libraries this week who are planning construction projects, so I wanted to remind you of important dates to keep in mind if your library is considering a project:

- The State calculations were released on May 8. FLLS will have \$1,171,777 to award for 2024-2025 construction projects.
- The State portal will open on Wednesday, June 5.
- Work done between July 1, 2024 and June 30, 2030 is eligible for award and library share (library share refers to the amount the library must contribute).
- Applications are due to FLLS by Friday, September 6 (with slight wiggle room until Monday, September 9 if needed).
- The FLLS Board of Trustees will vote on funding the projects on Wednesday, September 25. NY State law specifies that public library systems' board of trustees are the decision-making entities for NY State library construction projects.
- FLLS must submit all projects by Tuesday, October 1. This is a firm deadline with no exceptions to systems.
- If you are considering a construction project for this cycle, you MUST contact Sarah
  for a site visit. I will need to come to your library between now and the beginning of
  August to review your projects and take pictures.


